#### **CART PATHS**

Below is a small summary of the work that needs to be done on the cart paths. We have requested the quotations and as soon as we have received this we will start with the repairs and construction of the new paths.

#### **HOLE LOCATION, ACTION AND DISTANCE**

- Left of 1st green (Repair) 52m
- Holes 4 and 5 Entrance into cart path (new section) 7m
- Left of the 11th green A new path to blend into the existing cart path at the back of 12the tee box - 41m
- Between the 15th and 16th tee box (New Path) 21m
- Behind the 16th green (New Path) -118m
- 16th Tee Box (New exit on the existing path) -7m
- Existing cart path between 17 and 18 (Repair the first section of the existing path) -

## **Golf Course**

We are continuing to do some work on the fairways, and we are convinced that our fairways will be well established and enjoyed by our members and visitors within the next couple of seasons.

We are also working on the bunkers and ensuring that the playing surface is softer; we have seen some significant improvement, but this will be ongoing. Our greens are in great shape and playing very well. We are working hard on the putting green that seems to be under constant stress, we will monitor that green, and if required, we might need to look at reconstructing the putting green at some time.

During April, we will have the team from controlled irrigation do a complete audit of our irrigation system to ensure that we have adequate precipitation around the course.

## **Oom Jannie's Corner**

#### SCORING AND SCORECARDS

In this edition, I would like to further focus on scoring during competition days. We have noticed that some members do not know the difference between formats and they fill in their scorecards very poorly, this makes it extremely difficult for our scoring teams to correctly calculate the winners. In an attempt to assist members I have taken the opportunity to explain the different formats we often play and hopefully, this will improve the way the scorecards are filled in.

Remember the onus of each player is to correctly record the gross score and our scoring team will always ensure that the totals are correctly calculated.

Please fill in your scorecards correctly with the date, competition, and full names. For example, it is very difficult for the scorers if you only write down "Piet" or "Koos." Often the scorers have to take additional time to search who these players are and can easily make a mistake.

Only correctly signed and countersigned scorecards will be accepted in Club competitions. Competition scoring must be computed as follows:

• MEDAL:

Record the total number of strokes played on each hole, including any penalty strokes, and deduct the player's handicap from the total to obtain the net score for the round.

• BETTER BALL MEDAL:

Record both players' A and B scores and select the "better" of the two scores to obtain a Betterbal score for the round.

• BOGEY:

Scoring is on the players or better ball net score per hole and is recorded on the scorecard with a +(plus) for under par, o for par, and - (minus) for any score over par.

BOGEY PLUS:

Scoring is as above with Bogey, but ++ (plus, plus) is recorded for an Eagle (two under par) and +++ (plus, plus, plus, plus) for an Albatross (three under par)

• STABLEFORD:

Points are scored on the players, or better ball, net score for each hole played: 1 point for one over par; 2 points for a par; 3 points for a one-under-par (birdie); 4 points for a two-under-par (eagle) and so on.

• COMBINED BETTER BALL:

The best scores from players A and B are added together with the best net in whatever format the competition is played.

- COUNT OUT PROCEDURE
- a) Best last nine holes
- b) Best last six holes
- c) Best last three holes
- d) Strokes 1, 2, 3 etc.
